Return to Bowling: To come into effect on 8 June 2021 (changes are shown in red)

1. Introduction

Leinster Bowling Club cannot accept liability for the safety of members as they return to play under the current arrangements. Active members are reminded of their obligations to comply with current legislation and Government and HSE guidelines regarding travel, interacting with others, social distancing, hand hygiene and respiratory etiquette, and any other matters relevant to their safety and the safety of others in the Club environment.

Sport Ireland requires that these protocols apply to all members of the Club regardless of their vaccination status.

While Leinster Bowling Club has put in place protocols for optimising safety during the COVID-19 period members must take responsibility for their own decision as to whether to participate in the activities of the Club at this time and whether they take personal protection measures (e.g. the wearing of face coverings) beyond those provided in the measures below.

The Leinster Bowling Committee has agreed these protocols for play during this period. Revised protocols will be agreed and issued as the season in line with public health requirements.

Player health (issued by BLI and LBLI)

All players who have tested positive/in isolation for Covid-19 or are living with a Covid-19 positive person will not be permitted on the premises of Leinster Bowling Club and will be ineligible to do so until specific criteria are met:

- i) If you have tested positive you may not return to bowling for a minimum of 14 days and at least 5 days without fever or any other symptom, as per HSE guidelines;
- ii) If you are in self isolation you may not return to bowling for 14 days or until you have returned a negative test and are symptom free, whichever is less, as per HSE guidelines; and
- iii) If you are living with a Covid-19 positive person, you must also follow (ii), as per HSE guidelines

Players who have symptoms **or who have been referred by a doctor for a Covid-19 test** should notify the secretary of the Bowling Club if they were due to play, and start self-isolation **and stay away from the Club and follow public health regulations.**

Failure to adhere to these requirements could result in the immediate suspension of membership of the Bowling Section.

LEINSTER BOWLING CLUB PROTOCOLS FOR PLAY

1. Scope

- a) Attendance at the bowling green will be limited to members playing **or watching** bowls
- b) **Internal Club competitions will be permitted from 7 June 2021**
- c) There will be no **major** planned recruitment activities until further notice
- d) Prospective members who make contact directly with the Club, or are contacts of existing members, may visit the Club in the company of a member for up to three visits, after which they must join as a member or cease to visit the Club

2. To access the bowling green a player must:

- a) Be a member of Leinster Bowling Club, apart from prospective members (point 1 (d) above)
- b) Adhere to the government's regulations in relation to travel within the country and abroad
- c) Not be in self-isolation or living with a person who is self-isolating
- d) Not be displaying any COVID-19 symptoms
- e) Have a pre-booked rink time

3. Booking a Rink

- a) Only those players who are pre-booked may play
- b) Four rinks will be in use at any one time
- c) Rinks are available for singles and pairs games irrespective of the number of households involved
- d) An electronic booking system is in operation where you can book rinks up to a week in advance and the time slot will be 2 hours.
- e) The booking system is accessed from the Bowling Club website
- f) Members who need assistance or do not have access to the website may phone or text Anne FitzGerald (087 9182215) and she will assist in making your booking
- g) The daily booking times available are as follows:

11.00 to 13.00	17.00 to 19.00
13.00 to 15.00	19.00 to 21.00
15.00 to 17.00	

- h) We will have a turnaround time of 10 minutes. We would ask all players to leave on time and to arrive at the green no more than 10 minutes prior to playing time so as to avoid large gatherings
- i) Leinster Bowling Club will retain copies of each day's bookings so as to facilitate any contact tracing that the HSE may have to carry out, for this reason players are asked to adhere to their allotted time and rink once a booking is made
- j) Players are asked to leave their rink at the allotted time even if the rink is not booked for the subsequent session. This is to ensure that the correct attendance on the rinks is recorded for possible future contact tracing
- k) **All members visiting the Club as spectators must sign the Visitors' Book in the equipment room in the Bowlers' Pavilion**

4. Arrival

- a) At home prior to coming to the Bowling Green bowlers should clean and disinfect their bowls, towels, regulation bowling shoes and any other equipment they will take on the green. **Wheelie or other bowling bags may be brought to the green.**
- b) Ample car parking spaces are available to ensure social distancing
- c) Only regulation bowling shoes to be worn on the green
- d) Arrive at the green not more than 10 mins prior to reserved rink time
- e) On arrival at the green, turn right and follow the pathway to the right hand side down by the side of the club house so as to avoid the players exiting the green by the pathway adjacent to the tennis courts. Ensure that social distancing is observed at all times
- f) Please use the sanitiser that is attached to the end wall of the pavilion to sanitise your hands prior to entering the green
- g) Wait until all previous players have exited the area before proceeding onto the green to play
- h) Members who have been given permission to store their bowls in the Ladies Locker Room in the Bowlers' Pavilion should enter the Pavilion one at a time to collect their equipment. This equipment must then be sanitised outside beside the shed prior to play. **Congregation of people in the Pavilion is not permitted**

5. Equipment

- a) Members may play with up to four bowls at any time
- b) Members playing on their own should only use their own bowls and not take any additional bowls from the equipment room
- c) Members without their own bowls who wish to play may use four Club bowls taken from the equipment room. These bowls must be sanitised before play and sanitised and returned to the correct basket in the equipment room after play
- d) Take your bowls, towel and personal sanitiser to the green and place at your starting end
- e) Do not touch any other players' bowls with your hands
- f) Do not touch the jack at any time with your hands unless you are a designated lead
- g) **Mats may be moved during play**

6. On the Green

- a) Four players on a rink at any one time may only play singles or pairs games
- b) On any rink 3 or 4 bowlers standing at **same end** is not permitted
- c) When changing ends players must ensure social distancing Players should always walk to their left thus avoiding other players coming the other way
- d) **Measuring is now permitted during play**
- e) **Players may walk from the mat to look at the head**
- f) Use only your feet **or trolley** to move bowls after an end has been completed
- g) Bowls or jack in ditch to be removed using a towel or plastic gloves
- h) **Use of scoreboards and/or scorecards is permitted with one person responsible for changing the scores throughout the game**

7. Sanitising arrangements

(i) Mats:

- Before going to your rink take 2 mats from the hanger in the storage area and sanitise using the spray sanitiser provided

- After your game remove the mats from green and sanitise them again using the spray provided and hang up again in the storage area

(ii) Jacks:

There will be one yellow and one white jack per rink. They:

- **may be delivered during play**
- will be collected and sanitised before play by the players designated to roll/place the jacks
- will be returned by the designated players to the basin after the game and sanitised using the spray provided

(iii) Equipment:

All trolleys for moving the bowls and scoreboards must be sanitised before and after use

8. At the end of allotted playing time

- Players are requested to finish on time regardless of the score and return their mats and jacks to the storage area (see points 7 (i) and (ii) above)
- Take home **all** belongings including water bottles, plastic gloves, empty cups etc. leaving nothing behind on the green
- Please ensure that you wash and sanitise your bowls, hands, shoes and towels after playing
- Exit the green by using the pathway adjacent to the tennis courts maintaining social distancing and all players should exit the Club at the end of their game
- Use the sanitizer that is provided on the wall adjacent to the tennis courts to sanitise hands on leaving the green
- If there is nobody playing on the green when you finish LOCK all doors in the Pavilion before leaving**

9. Miscellaneous Issues

- Toilet facilities are the only facilities available in the Bowlers' Pavilion; there are no facilities for making tea/coffee
- Members are requested to bring their personal sanitiser for use on their equipment and during play on the green. Hand sanitiser and disinfectant will also be provided at the Bowlers' Pavilion
- No sharing of bowls or equipment is permitted
- The Greens Manager (Paul Smyth) will change settings and direction of play No other player is permitted to change these settings

It is the aim of the Bowling Committee to keep members safe so please observe the guidelines. It will require the co-operation of all players. Guidelines may have to be changed on an on- going basis. We will endeavour to keep you informed. Keep hand washing, sanitising and social distancing at all times.
